

They bring the injured service members to a safe and accepting environment and show them that life is still good, that they do not need to stay in their hospital rooms agonizing over what they have lost or how their lives have changed.

The Veterans Committee members discussed various ways the Elks Lodge can support the Aleethia Foundation and play a role in supporting injured service members and their families through the early phases of the healing process. The Committee agreed to host one or more Friday night dinners for the Aleethia Foundation. The Committee is applying for an Impact Grant to fund future Friday night dinners.

The Committee discussed other activities including the Friday night bingo games at the Martinsburg VA Hospital on the fifth Fridays of the month, the Carnival at the Martinsburg VA Hospital for veterans and family members, and the 2014 Veterans Day program. 
