The members noticed that the ballroom floor/ceiling of the lounge was moving up and down in such a way that seemed unsafe. Acting upon the concern of the members, the Board commissioned a thorough inspection be conducted by Fernandez and Associates Structural Engineers, p.c. to assess the structural integrity of the Lodge building. The report of the inspection by Fernandez and Associates stated that it complies with the Codes of the County of Fairfax. It further states that, "This floor will vibrate even by any one walking on it, much less being used as a dance floor; however, it is "safe." The Board hopes that this will assure all members of the Lodge that our building is structurally sound.

We encourage you to attend our meetings held at 7:00 p.m. on the first and third Tuesday of the month, and welcome your recommendations. Only with your help and support will our Lodge continue to be successful.

Currently, Golf Association members are contacted by email a week before with instructions for each event. When they want to play, they must respond by the Thursday preceding the event either by email or phone. If they want to play with a particular person or group, they should provide that information in their response. Elks who want to play, but are not Association members, can play as guests. Players should report to the golf course at least 30 minutes prior to the tee time and pay their green fee in the pro shop. Next, they should report to the golf committee desk, pay a \$3 fee, get their hole assignment, buy 50/50 tickets (optional) and receive any pertinent instructions for that day's play. Then everyone should report to their golf carts and be ready to play fifteen minutes before the tee time to receive instructions from the golf course representative and/or the tournament director and witness the 50/50 drawing.

All Lodge 2188 members are invited to join the Golf Association. However, as stated above, they do not have to join to play.


